**Severe Weather Warnings:** Areas affected by thundershowers may experience strong wind gusts, intense rainfall, and possible lightning strikes. Residents are advised to exercise caution during these conditions.

**Marine Advisory:** Rough sea conditions are expected to persist due to strong surface winds and elevated sea swells. Small vessel operators, fisherfolk, and other marine users should exercise extreme caution and remain vigilant while at sea during this period.

**Weather Brief for Sunday, 21 June 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

**Timehri (NWWC) in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 43.2 mm.**

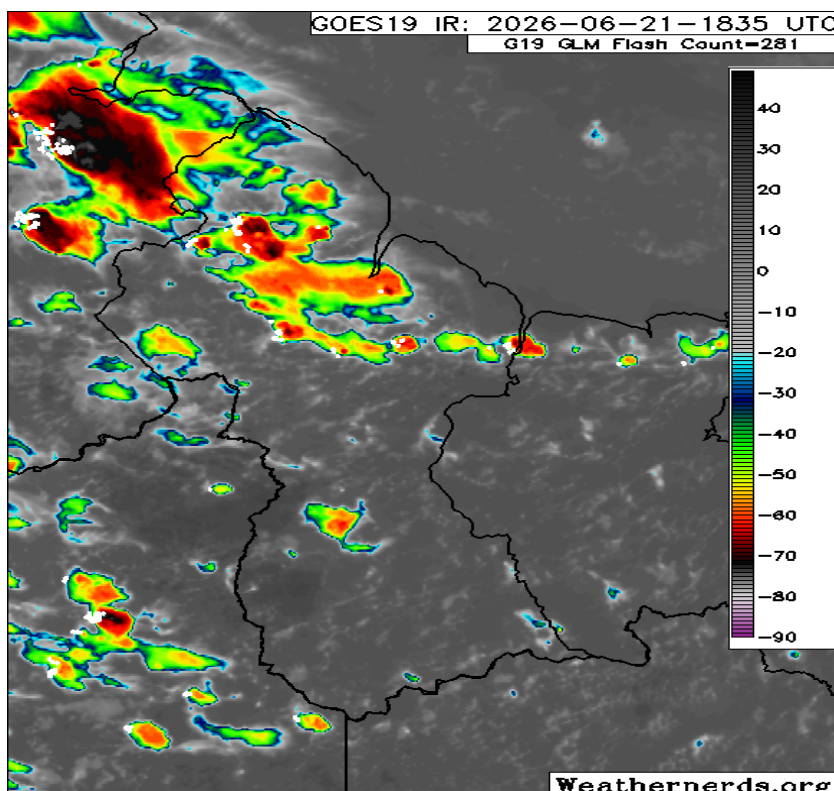
**Synopsis:** A high-pressure ridge remains the dominant feature influencing weather conditions across Guyana. Low-level convergence and localized daytime heating have generated isolated areas of deep convection over coastal and near-inland locations from mid-morning through early afternoon. Conditions are expected to become increasingly unstable from early Tuesday morning as another tropical wave approaches the region. In its wake, the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) will maintain unsettled conditions across the country throughout Wednesday, supporting cloudiness, showers, and occasional thunderstorms.

**Today's weather review:** Mix of sunshine and clouds were observed throughout Guyana with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms over some coastal and near inland areas.

**Sea conditions:**

Open waters are expected to be moderate to rough with northeast to easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters (6 to 9 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh northeast to easterly breeze.

**Extended Forecast**

Tuesday: Overcast skies with frequent showers and thundershowers across Northern Guyana during the morning. Elsewhere, scattered showers in the afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 40 and 80 mm over northern Guyana with the highest expected over Regions 1 and 2. Elsewhere, values between 20 and 40 mm.

Wednesday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent showers and rain. Thunderstorms can be expected during the morning hours. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 60 mm.

Thursday to Saturday, cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers and isolated thunderstorms can be expected across Guyana. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 10 and 30 mm within 24 hours of accumulations.
