Weather Brief for Monday, 02 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 02 February 2026 were available for most of the stations. **Fort Island in Region recorded the highest rainfall of 20.4 mm.**

Marine Advisory: Spring tides coupled with high-energy waves will likely create dangerous sea conditions and possible overtopping and damage to river and sea defences. All marine users should remain on high alert, and persons living in low-lying coastal and riverine areas should take all necessary precautions.



Synopsis: Continued strong subsidence and ridge dominate Guyana, generating mainly stable conditions.

Today's weather review: Except for passing showers over parts of regions 6, 7, 8, and 10, mainly fair and sunny skies were observed across Guyana.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

Moderate to rough in open waters with northeasterly waves reaching 2.5 to 3.0 meters (6 to 9 ft) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of 8 and 15 seconds
- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday through Sunday: Mostly fair and sunny skies with a few passing showers are likely to prevail across Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.
