Weather Brief for Tuesday, 01 July 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 01 July 2025 were available for most of the stations. Lovely lass in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 64.1mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Strong winds and lightning strikes will likely occur in areas of thundershowers. Persons should exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: None at this time.

Synopsis: Surface confluence and low-level troughs produced mild to moderate instabilities over mostly northern regions of the forecast area. Similar atmospheric conditions are expected for tomorrow and from Thursday, Tropical wave #9 is projected to impact Guyana, affecting mostly northern regions of the country.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated afternoon showers were observed over regions 8 and 9. Elsewhere, mostly cloudy skies with light to moderate showers, intermittent rain, and isolated thundershowers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, July 02 to 11, 2025, is 10.4 mm per day.

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

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

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Sea conditions:

- -Moderate easterly seas with swells reaching 2.0 to 2.5 meters in open waters.
- -These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

<u>Thursday, Sunday, and Monday:</u> Mostly cloudy skies with light to heavy showers and intermittent rain are likely over Guyana. Inland regions can expect isolated thundershowers in the afternoon. Rainfall is expected between 15 mm and 40 mm within 24 hours.

<u>Friday and Saturday:</u> Cloudy skies with scattered showers in the morning are likely over coastal Guyana, becoming partly cloudy and sunny afterwards. Remaining regions can expect mostly sunny skies in the morning, becoming cloudy in the afternoon with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm over coastal Guyana, elsewhere between 10 mm and 30 mm within 24 hours.
