Weather Brief for Wednesday, 09 July 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Wednesday, 09 July 2025 were available for most of the stations. De Kinderen Back in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 46.7 mm.



Severe Weather Advisory: In areas of thundershowers, strong winds and lightning strikes are likely to occur. Persons are encouraged to exercise all necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: None at this time.

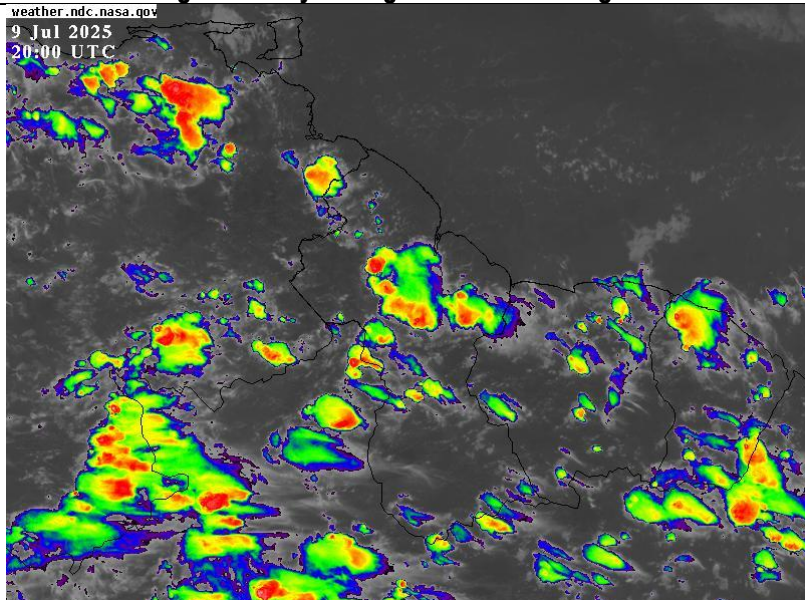
Synopsis: Moisture convergence and surface confluence produce instabilities over inland and southern regions. Mid-upper-level wind shear, subsidence, and SAL inhibit convection elsewhere, generating mainly stable conditions. During the upcoming 3 – 4 days, surface to low-level systems along an approaching tropical wave embedded with the ITCZ are projected to produce instabilities over the forecast area.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies in the afternoon with light to heavy showers and thundershowers were observed over inland and southern regions. The remaining regions observed mostly sunny skies with isolated showers.

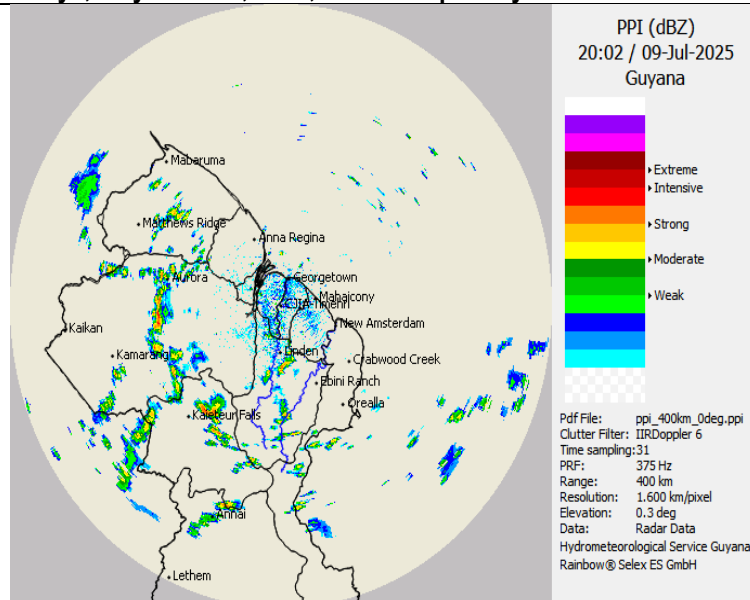

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, July 10 to 19, 2025, is 9.3 mm per day.



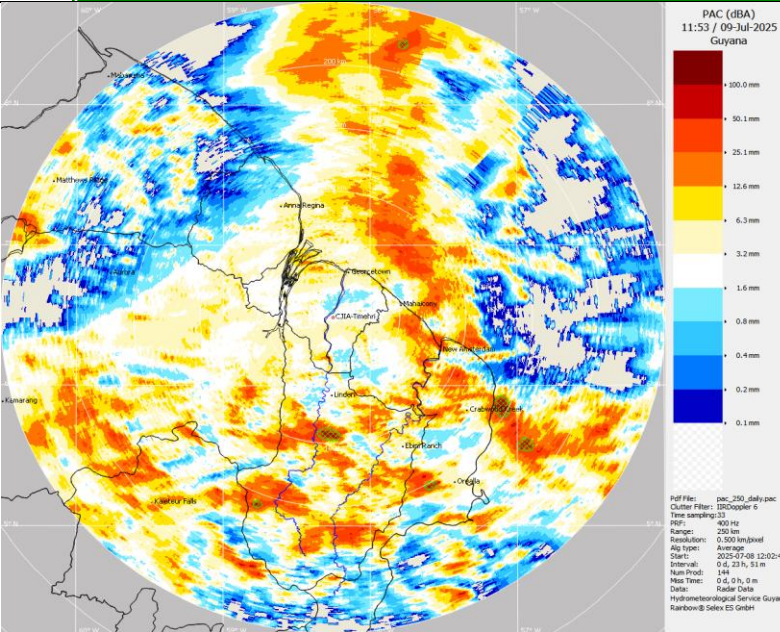
Infrared Satellite image valid at 20:00 UTC (16:00hrs) Wednesday, 09 July 2025.



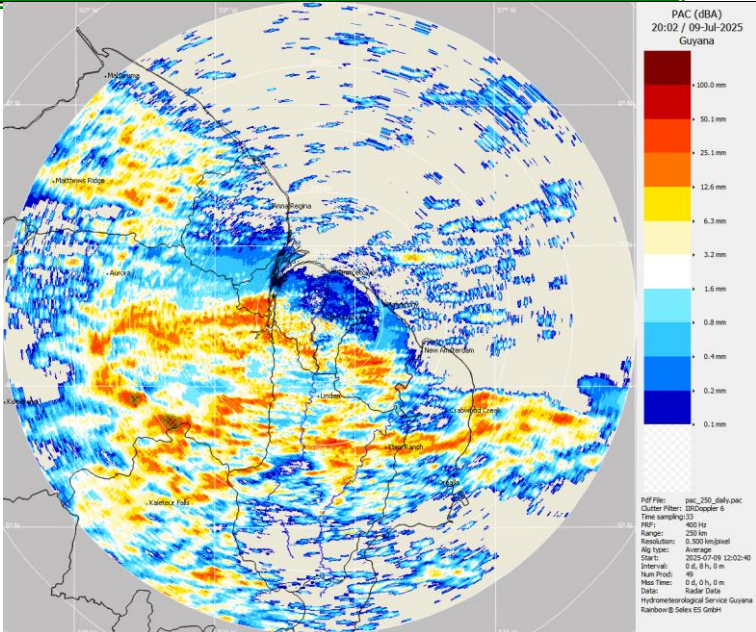
Radar image valid at 20:00 UTC (16:00hrs) Wednesday, 09 July 2025.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Friday through Sunday: Cloudy to overcast skies with periods of light to heavy showers and rain. Isolated thundershowers are expected over coastal regions in the morning and other regions in the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 60 mm within 24 hours.**

Monday and Tuesday: Cloudy skies with periods of light to heavy showers and rain are likely over coastal Guyana in the morning hours, becoming partly cloudy and sunny afterward. All remaining regions can expect cloudy to overcast skies in the afternoon with light to heavy showers, thundershowers, and rain. **Rainfall is expected between 15 mm and 35 mm over coastal Guyana, remaining regions between 20 mm and 60 mm within 24 hours.**
