Weather Brief for Tuesday, 04 March 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 04 March 2025 were available for most of the stations. No.4 Back Dam in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 11.9 mm.

<u>Severe Weather Advisory:</u> Due to the meandering and building of the Atlantic high-pressure system, moderate to strong surface winds are generated which can damage vulnerable buildings, structures, and homes. Residents are advised to take all precautionary measures during this time to safeguard life and property.

<u>Marine Advisory:</u> The meandering and building of the Atlantic high-pressure system are generating strong surface-to-low-level winds across the region. As a result, rough seas with swell heights ranging from 2.5 m to 3.0 m in open waters are currently being experienced. These conditions, coupled with spring tide, are likely to lead to hazardous sea conditions. Therefore, coastal residents, fisherfolks, and other marine users are advised to exercise extreme caution during this time.

<u>Special Information:</u> High concentrations of Saharan dust moved over the forecast area. Residents, marine, and small aircraft users should be aware of some reduction in visibility, restriction in deep convective cloud development, and skies appearing slightly yellowish due to the strong presence of dust. Persons sensitive to changes in air quality are advised to take the necessary precautions.


Synopsis: The forecast area is dominated by SAL, ridging, and subsidence producing mostly stable conditions. Models are projecting significant increases in instabilities from Friday into the weekend.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Apart from a few passing showers, mostly sunny skies with haze were observed.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

- -Moderate to rough seas from the northeast with swells reaching 2.5 to 3.0 meters in open waters.
- -These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh breeze from the northeast to the east.

Extended Forecast

<u>Thursday:</u> Partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected between 0 and 10 mm within 24 hours.

<u>Friday, Saturday, and Sunday:</u> Overcast skies with frequent to continuous rain and thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 30 and 80 mm within 24 hours.

Monday: Cloudy skies with frequent rain and thundershowers are likely over regions 6, and 8 to 10. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy skies with frequent showers. Rainfall is expected between 25 and 60 mm over regions 6, and 8 to 10, elsewhere between 10 and 25 mm within 24 hours.
