**Weather Brief for Saturday, 08 March 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana**





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 08 March 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Melville Wakenaam in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 54.2 mm.**

**Severe Weather Advisory:** Given the observed conditions over the past 12-24 hours, along with current and forecast conditions for southern regions 6 and 9, soils may already be saturated and additional rainfall may lead to flooding. Also, heavy winds and lightning strikes are possible in these regions. Persons are asked to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

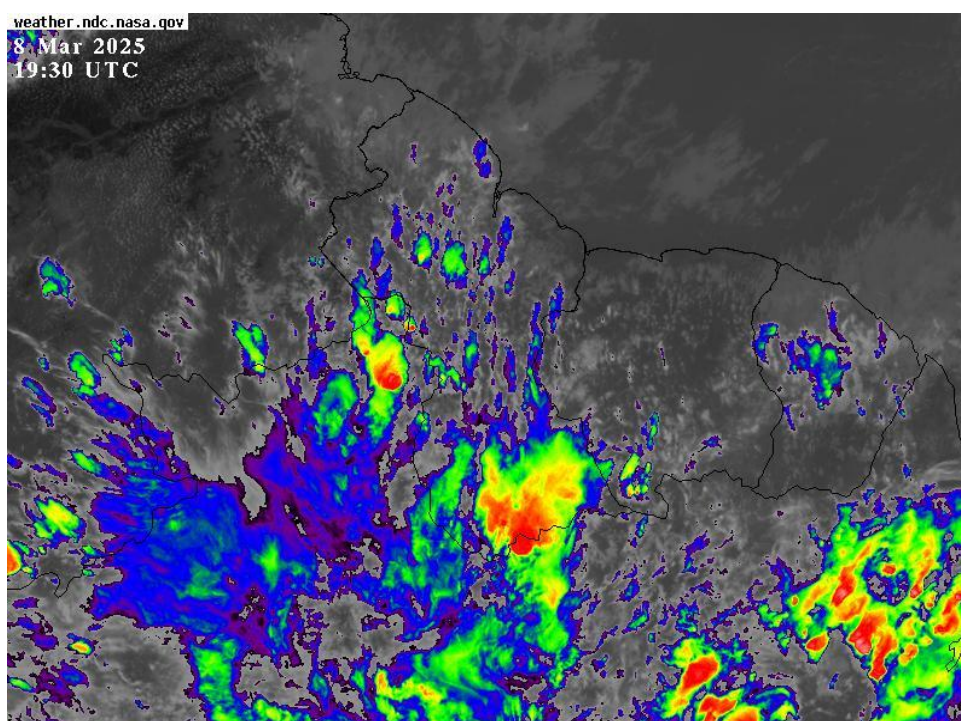
**Synopsis:** High moisture convergence with low-level troughs and upper-level support produced widespread instabilities.

**Today's weather review:** Mostly cloudy to occasionally overcast skies with light to moderate showers and rain were observed. Isolated thundershowers were also observed over the southern region 6, 9, and the inland regions.

**Spring Tide Advisory:** The spring tide is not in effect.

**Sea conditions:**

- Moderate seas from the east with swells reaching 2.0 to 2.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate breeze from the northeast to the east.

**Extended Forecast**

**Monday and Tuesday:** Regions 6 and 9 can expect partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief morning and afternoon showers. Rainfall is expected between 5 mm and 20 mm over regions 6 and 9, and in the remaining regions between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.

**Wednesday and Thursday:** Overcast skies with frequent to continuous rain and thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 40 mm and 90 mm within 24 hours.

**Friday:** Regions 6 to 10 can expect partly cloudy skies with occasional showers in the afternoon. All the remaining regions can expect morning cloudy spells with brief showers becoming mostly fair afterwards. Rainfall is expected between 5 mm and 20 mm over regions 6 to 10, and in the remaining regions between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.
