**Weather Brief for Monday, 10 March 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana**





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 10 March 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Portage Landing in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 53.6 mm.**

**Severe Weather Advisory:** Given the observed conditions over the past 2 days, along with current and forecast conditions for southern regions 6 and 9, soils may already be saturated and additional rainfall may lead to flooding. Persons are asked to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

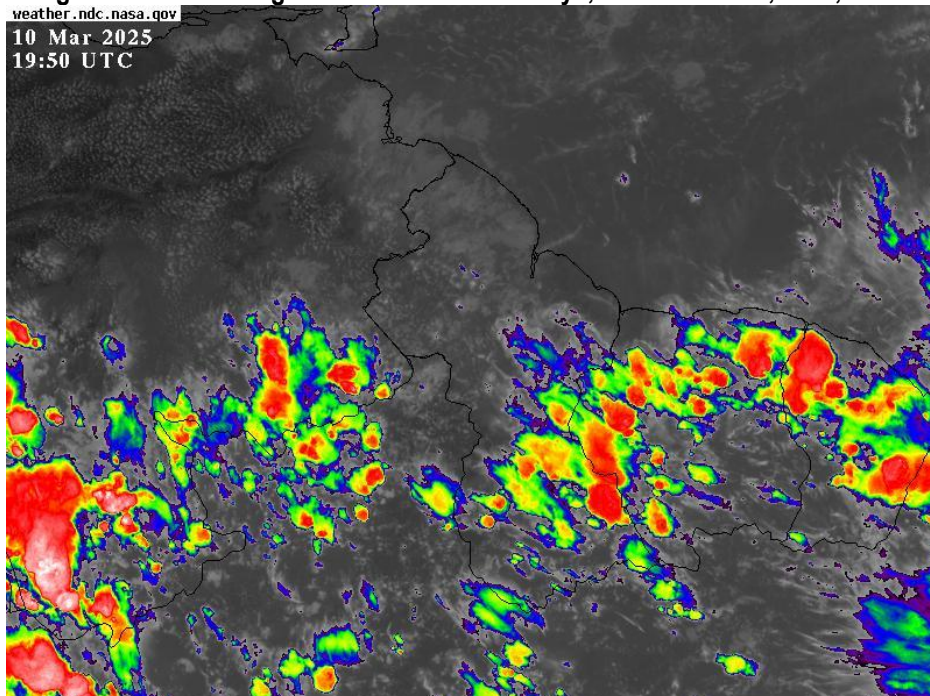
**Synopsis:** Easterly troughs with high moisture and upper-level support produced widespread instabilities over inland and southern regions. Remaining regions dominated by trade-wind moisture plumes which produced weak instabilities.

**Today's weather review:** Inland and southern regions observed partly cloudy skies becoming cloudy to overcast in the afternoon with light to heavy showers, thundershowers and occasional rain. The remaining regions observed partly cloudy to cloudy skies with light showers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, March 11 to 20, 2025, is 4.2 mm per day.

**Spring Tide Advisory:** The spring tide will be in effect from tomorrow afternoon.

**Sea conditions:**

- Moderate seas from the east with swells reaching 2.0 to 2.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate breeze from the northeast to the east.

**Extended Forecast**

**Wednesday and Thursday:** Overcast skies with frequent to continuous rain and thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 40 mm and 90 mm within 24 hours.

**Friday:** Coastal Guyana can expect partly cloudy skies with brief showers. The remaining areas can expect cloudy skies with light to heavy showers and intermittent rain. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm over coastal Guyana and between 20 mm and 50 mm in the remaining regions within 24 hours.

**Saturday and Sunday:** Cloudy skies with light to heavy showers and intermittent rain are likely over the forecast area. Isolated thundershowers can be expected over inland and southern regions in the afternoon. Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 50 mm within 24 hours.
