Weather Brief for Saturday, 01 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 01 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. Sophia in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 20.2 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible in areas of thundershowers. Persons are advised to exercise caution.


Marine Advisory: Strong surface winds, coupled with spring tides, will generate rough and dangerous seas, leading to possible overtopping and damage to river and sea defenses. Marine users and persons along coastal and riverine areas are advised to exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: Surface to lower atmospheric troughs and confluencing associated with very high moisture generated weak to strong instabilities over the forecast area.

Today's weather review: Coastal Guyana observed morning cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers, becoming mostly fair and sunny afterwards. All other areas observed partly cloudy and sunny skies in the morning, becoming cloudy to overcast in the afternoon with occasional rain, thundershowers, and showers.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect and will continue until November 9, 2025.

Sea conditions:

- -Moderate to rough easterly seas with swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters in open waters.
- -These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 10 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Monday, Thursday, and Friday: Cloudy skies with occasional rain and isolated thundershowers are likely over coastal Guyana in the morning and elsewhere in the afternoon. Rainfall is between 20 mm and 45 mm within 24 hours.

<u>Tuesday:</u> Regions 7, 8, and 10 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated thundershowers and showers in the afternoon. All other regions can expect mainly fair and sunny skies. Rainfall is between 0 mm and 10 mm over regions 7, 8, and 10; elsewhere, no significant rainfall is likely within 24 hours.

<u>Wednesday:</u> Cloudy to overcast skies with occasional rain and thundershowers over regions 1 and 2. Elsewhere, generally fair and sunny skies are likely to persist. Rainfall is between 20 mm and 40 mm over regions 1 and 2; elsewhere, no significant rainfall is likely within 24 hours.
