Weather Brief for Tuesday, 04 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 04 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Maria's Pleasure in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 58.8 mm.**

Severe Weather Advisory: Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible in areas of thundershowers. Persons are advised to exercise caution.
Marine Advisory: Spring tides coupled with high-energy waves will likely cause overtopping and damage to river and sea defenses. Marine users and persons along coastal and riverine areas are advised to exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

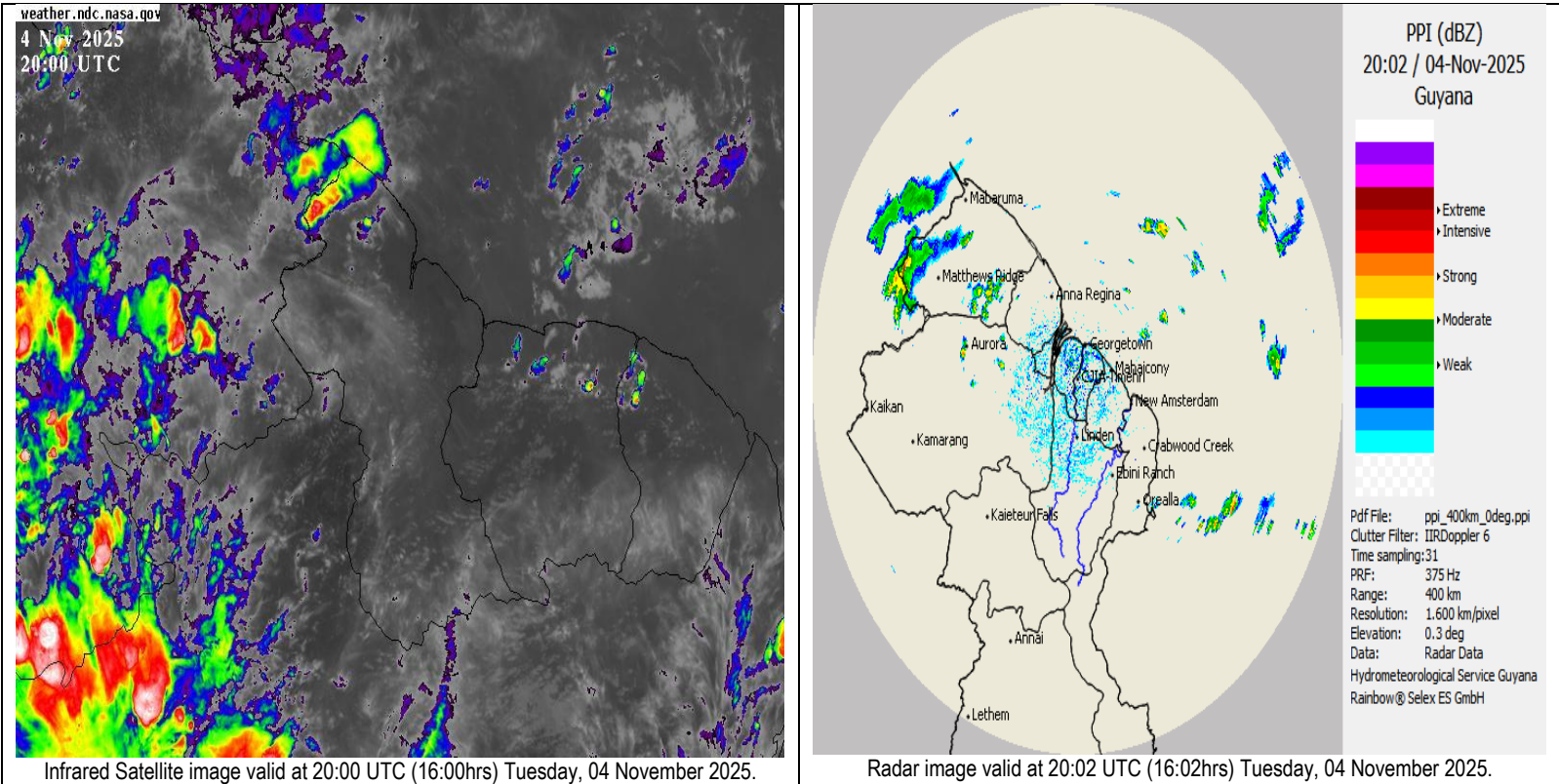
Synopsis: ITCZ over the northern parts of Guyana produced instabilities in these regions. It is projected to meander over the coast and northern parts of the country in the upcoming week, as it would enhance other surface to low-level systems to produce instabilities over the forecast area.

Today's weather review: Regions 1, 2, and the northern parts of 7 observed cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated showers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, November 05 to 14, 2025, is 4.0 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect and will continue until November 9, 2025.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate easterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 12 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate northeasterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday: Cloudy to overcast skies with occasional rain and thundershowers are likely across Guyana. Rainfall is between 20 mm and 60 mm within 24 hours.

Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers are likely across Guyana. Rainfall is between 10 mm and 30 mm within 24 hours.

Saturday: Partly cloudy skies with occasional showers and thundershowers are likely over regions 1 to 3 and 7. Elsewhere, mostly fair and sunny with isolated showers. Rainfall is between 10 mm and 20 mm over regions 1 to 3 and 7, elsewhere between 0 mm and 5 mm within 24 hours.

Sunday and Monday: Southern regions 6 and 9 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. All other regions cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent rain and thundershowers. Rainfall is between 0 mm and 10 mm over southern regions 6 and 9, elsewhere, between 20 mm and 50 mm within 24 hours.
