Weather Brief for Monday, 10 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 10 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Richmond Hill in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 89.4 mm.**

Severe Weather Advisory: Given recent rainfall, soils may already be saturated, and coupled with forecast conditions indicating more rainfall, this can lead to flooding or exacerbate flooding in low-lying areas and areas of poor drainage. In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can also be expected. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.

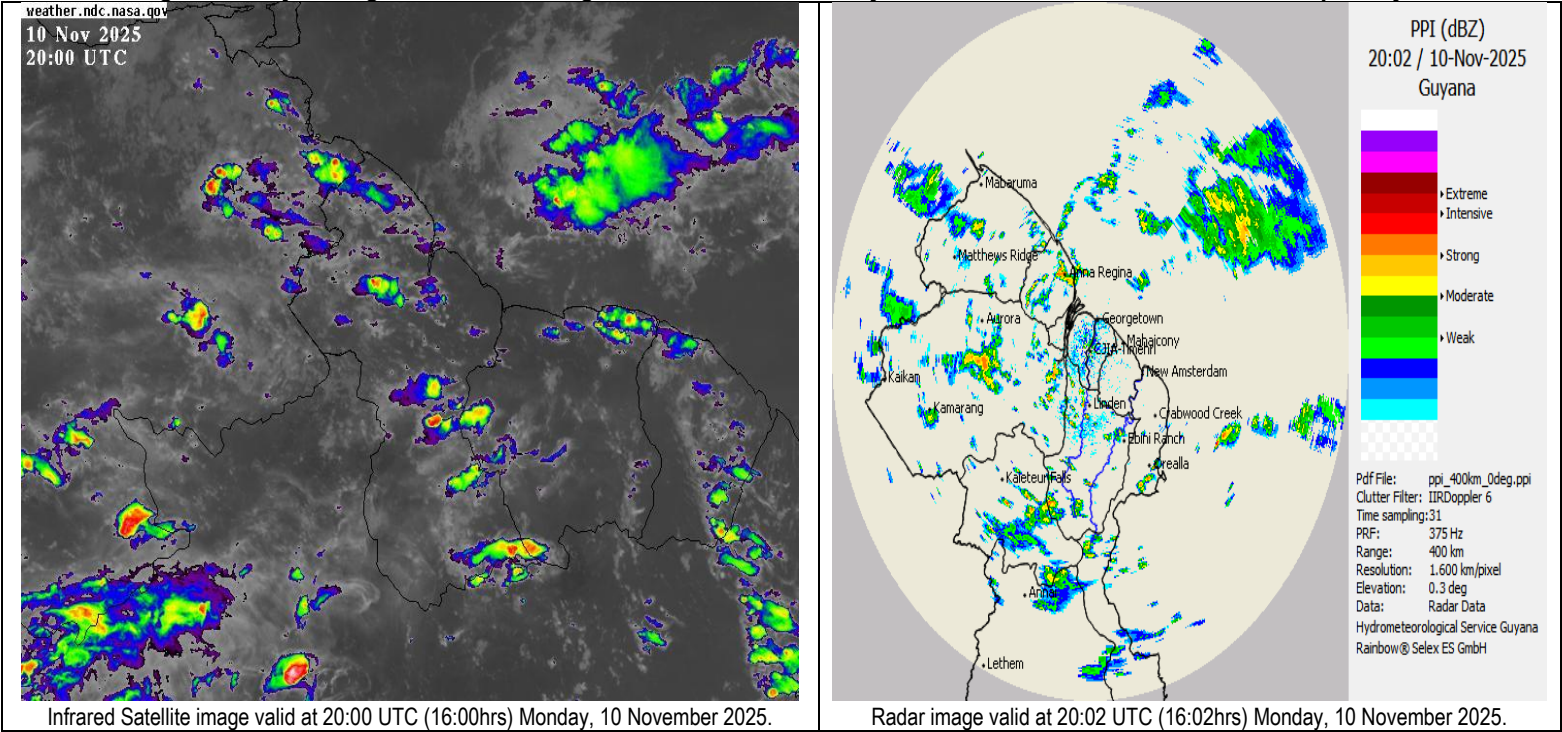
Synopsis: Moisture convergence and low-level troughs enhanced by the ITCZ, which produced moderate to strong instabilities over most of the northern parts of the country. The remaining southern parts generated pockets of mild to moderate instabilities. Dynamic models show projections of similar atmospheric conditions for the remainder of the week.

Today’s weather review: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent rain, showers, and thundershowers were observed across Guyana. Conditions improved over coastal regions in the afternoon.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, November 11 to 20, 2025, is 4.8 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate easterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 9 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday through Friday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent rain, showers, and thundershowers are likely over regions 1 to 7 and 10. These conditions are expected to improve over coastal regions in the afternoon. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. **Rainfall is expected between 25 mm and 70 mm over regions 1 to 7 and 10, and other regions between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.**

Saturday and Sunday: Morning cloudy skies with frequent showers are likely over regions 1 to 4 and 7, becoming partly cloudy to sunny afterward. Other regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. **Rainfall is expected between 10 mm and 35 mm over regions 1 to 4 and 7, and other regions between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.**
