Weather Brief for Wednesday, 19 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Wednesday, 19 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Bush Lot in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 88.1 mm.**

Severe Weather Advisory: Given recent rainfall, soils may already be saturated, and with the current forecast, low-level and poor drainage areas may experience flooding, and in areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can be expected. Persons should exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: Long-period-high-energy waves can cause damage to the river and sea defences in vulnerable areas. Persons should exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

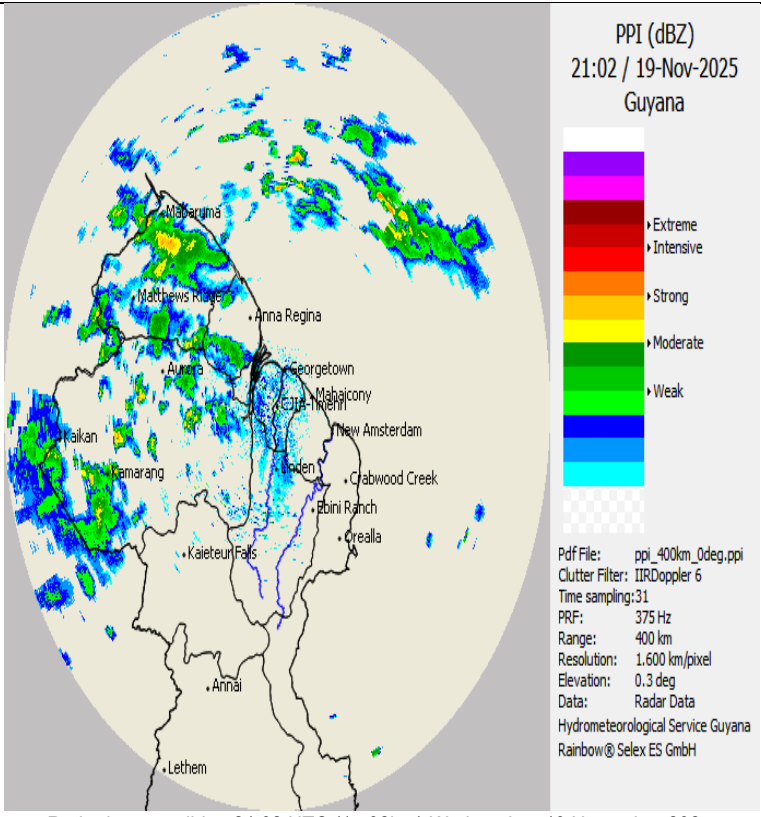
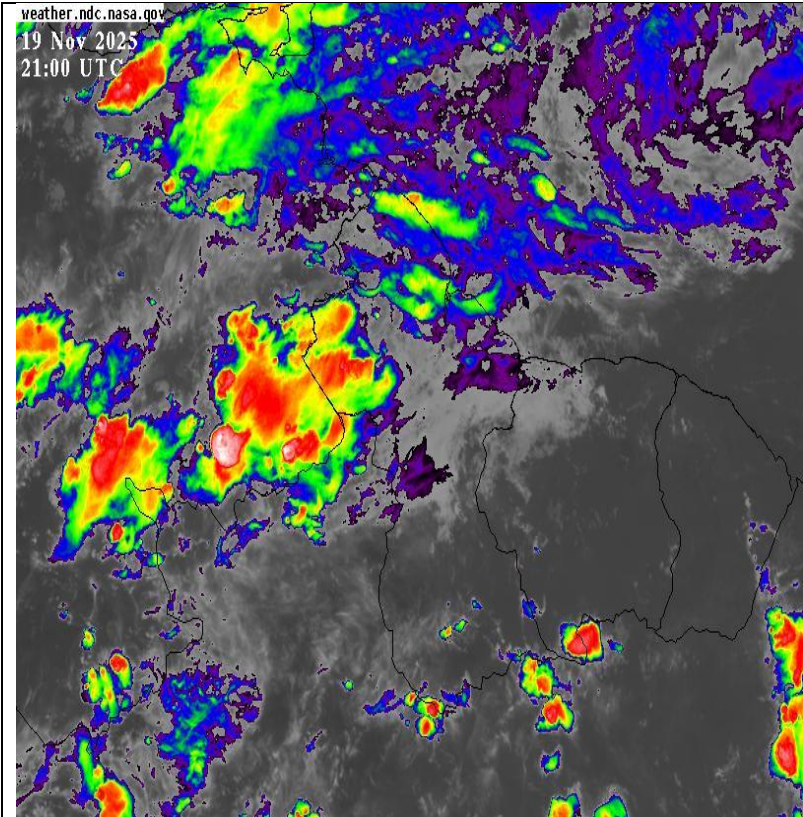
Synopsis: Moisture convergence and low-level (700hPa) trough enhanced by the ITCZ produced moderate to strong instabilities over most of the northern regions country. Dynamic models show projections of these conditions to continue as instabilities behind the trough axis to affect more in the morning hours.

Today’s weather review: Mostly cloudy skies with occasional to frequent showers and isolated thundershowers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, November 20 to 29, 2025, is 7.1 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 12 and 13 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Friday and Tuesday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief showers are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.

Saturday and Monday: Cloudy to overcast skies with frequent rain and thundershowers are likely over regions 1 to 3 and 7, elsewhere mostly cloudy skies with occasional showers. Rainfall is expected between 25 mm and 60 mm over regions 1 to 3 and 7, other regions between 10 mm and 25 mm within 24 hours.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy skies with intermittent rain and thundershowers are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 45 mm within 24 hours.
