Weather Brief for Sunday, 23 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 23 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. **St. Denny's Mission in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 63.0 mm.**

Severe Weather Advisory: Given recent rainfall, soils may already be saturated, and with the current forecast, low-level and poor drainage areas may experience flooding, and in areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can be expected. Persons should exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Strong winds and lightning strikes in areas of thunderstorms. Persons should exercise caution to safeguard life and property.

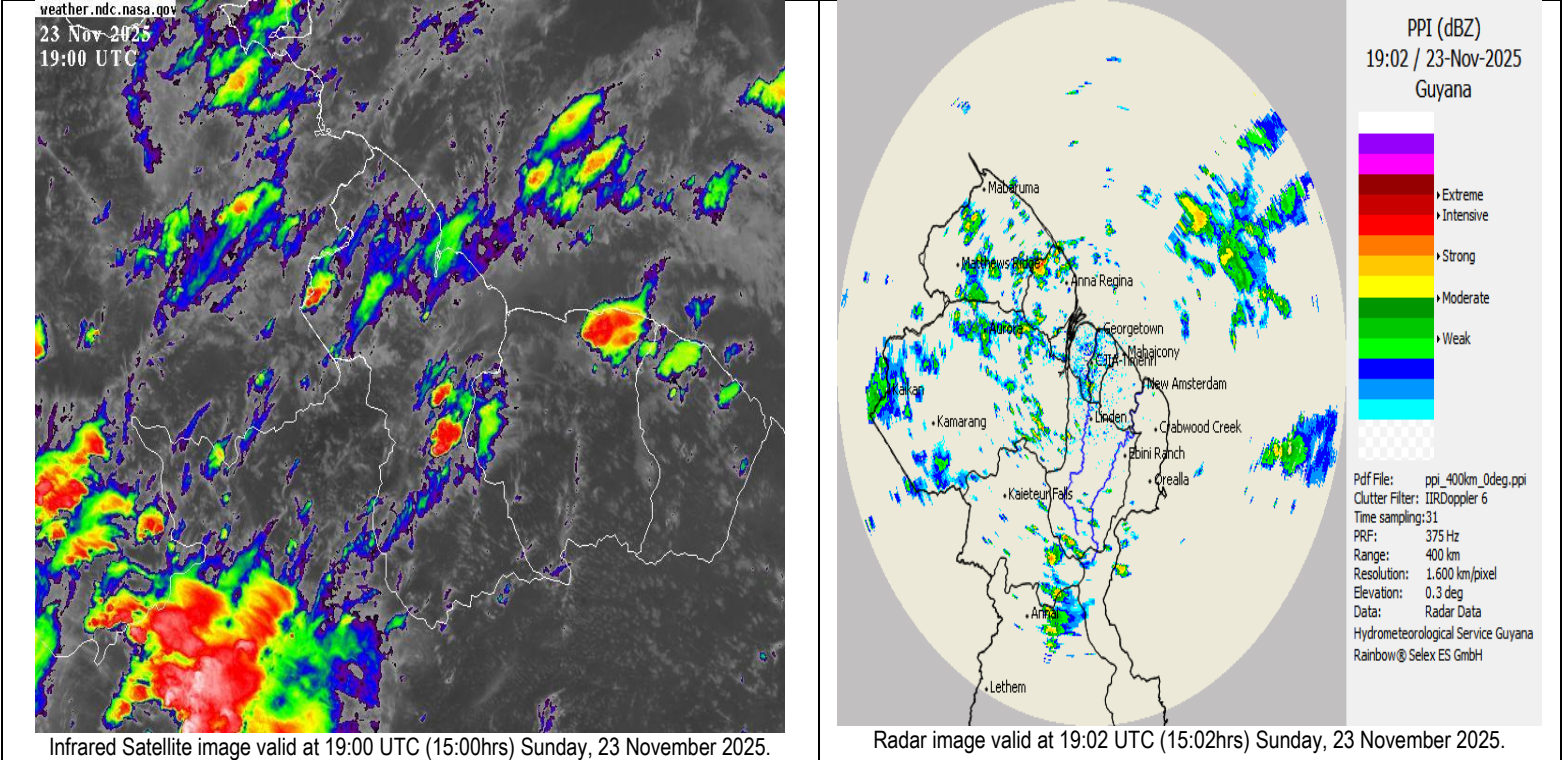
Synopsis: Moisture convergence, along with low-level troughs enhanced by the ITCZ over the northern parts of the country, produced moderate to strong instabilities. Dynamic models show projections of these conditions to continue into tomorrow, after which subsidence and ridging are to dominate, generating mostly stable conditions from Tuesday through Thursday.

Today's weather review: Regions 6, 8, 9, and 10 observed mostly cloudy skies with brief showers and isolated thundershowers. In the remaining areas, cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent showers, thundershowers, and rain were observed.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, November 24 to December 03, 2025, is 8.0 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 6 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate northeasterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Thursday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with occasional showers over regions 1, 2, and 7, in the remaining regions brief showers. Rainfall is expected between 5 mm and 20 mm over regions 1, 2 and 7, in other regions between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.

Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.

Saturday: Mostly cloudy skies with intermittent rain and thundershowers are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 40 mm within 24 hours.
