Weather Brief for Thursday, 27 November 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Thursday, 27 November 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Track-F-Bydarabu in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 44.8 mm.**

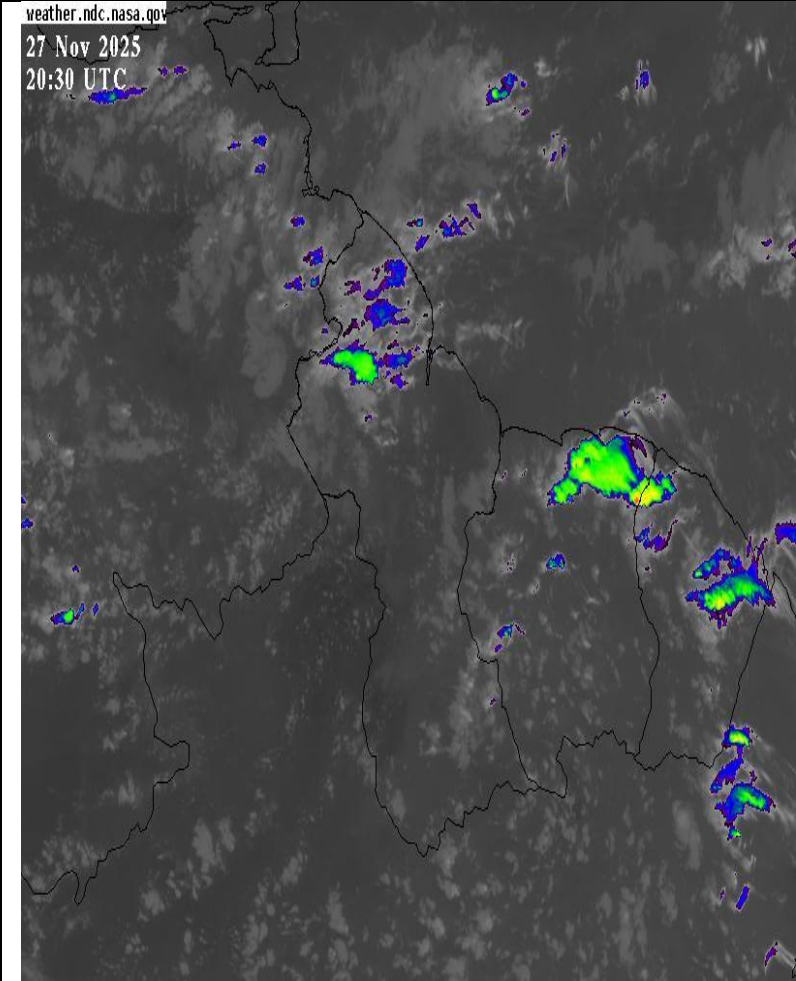
Synopsis: Trade wind moisture convergence and weak amplitude troughs produced instabilities over some northern parts of the country; the remaining southern parts were dominated by subsidence and strong wind shear. Confluence and low-level trough associated with very high moisture transported from the ITCZ east of Guyana is projected to produce widespread moderate to strong instabilities in the next 2 days.

Today’s weather review: Southern regions 6,8,9, and region 10 observed partly cloudy and sunny skies with a few showers, the remaining regions observed cloudy spells with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers.

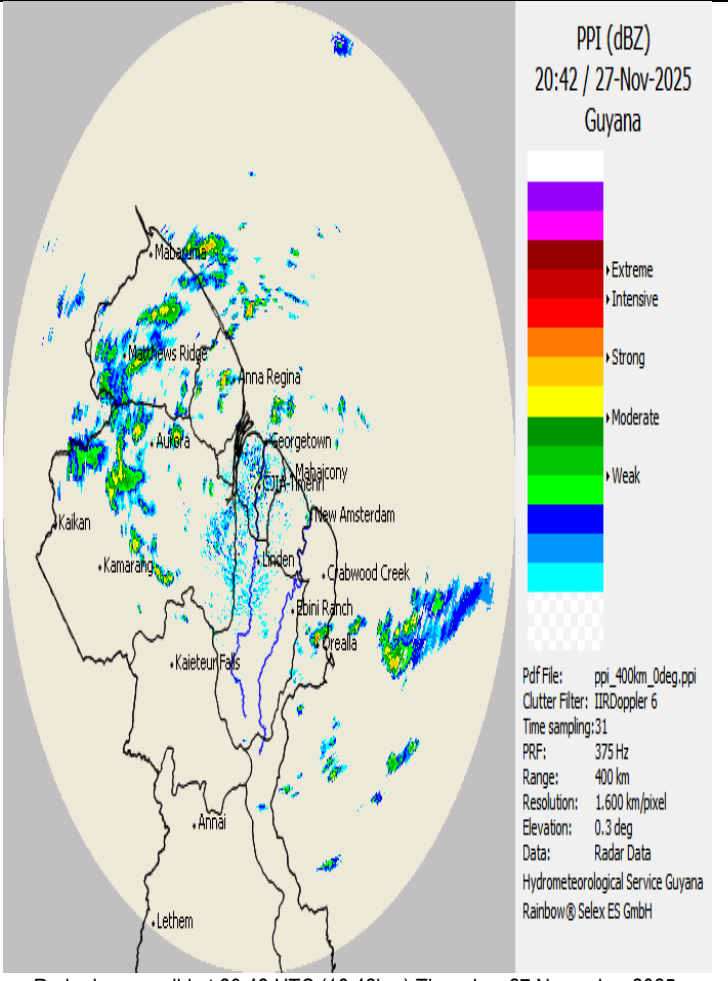

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate northeasterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday: Cloudy to overcast skies with occasional rain and scattered thundershowers are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 60 mm within 24 hours.

Sunday through Wednesday: Southern regions 6,8, and 9 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief showers, the remaining regions cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm over southern regions 6, 8 and 9, the remaining regions between 10 mm and 40 mm within 24 hours.
