Weather Brief for Friday, 11 October 2024 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Friday, 11 October 2024 were available for most of the stations. Mabaruma in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 19.1 mm.

<u>Severe Weather Advisory:</u> Areas with thundershowers will experience lightning strikes and strong winds. Persons are asked to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms. Long-period waves will likely result in damage to river and sea defenses. All marine users are asked to exercise caution during this time.


Synopsis: Moisture plumes advected from the ITCZ enhanced surface-to-lower atmospheric troughs and confluence-produced instabilities.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Regions 1 to 4, 7, 8, and 10 observed cloudy skies with light to moderate showers and isolated thundershowers. All the remaining regions observed partly cloudy and sunny skies.

Sea conditions:

- -Moderate seas from the northeast with swells reaching 2.0 to 2.5 meters in open waters.
- -These waves will likely have periods of between 9 and 11 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Sunday through Thursday: Mainly fair and sunny skies are likely to prevail across Guyana. However inland areas of regions 1 to 5, 7, and 10 can expect scattered showers and isolated thundershowers in the afternoon. Rainfall is expected between 5 and 20 mm over inland areas of regions 1 to 5, 7, and 10, and elsewhere no significant rainfall is expected within 24 hours.
