Weather Brief for Sunday, 19 October 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 19 October 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Wauna White Water in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 87.7 mm.**

Marine Advisory: High Atlantic surface winds, spring tides, and high-energy waves together will contribute to generating damage and overtopping of river and sea defences, which may also lead to flooding in low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas. Persons are advised to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

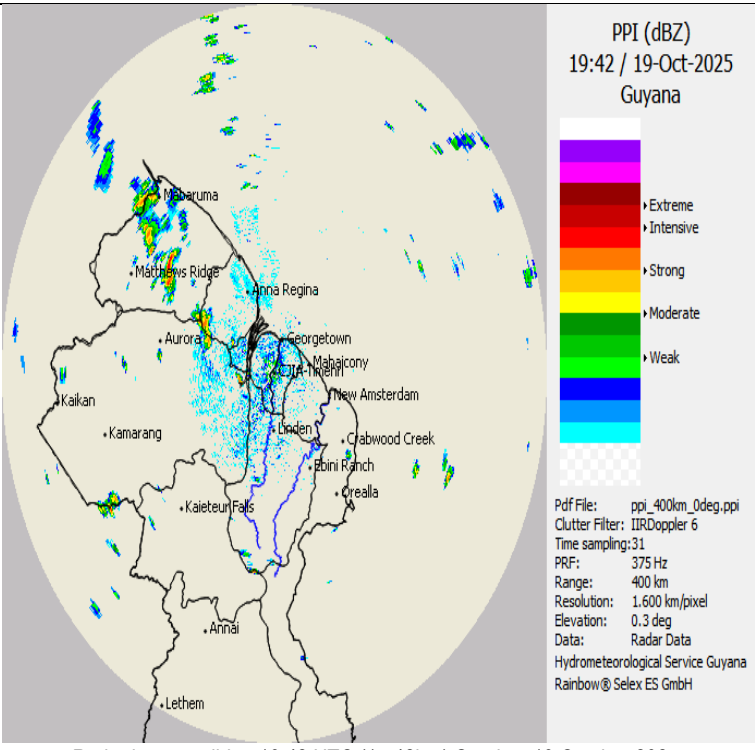
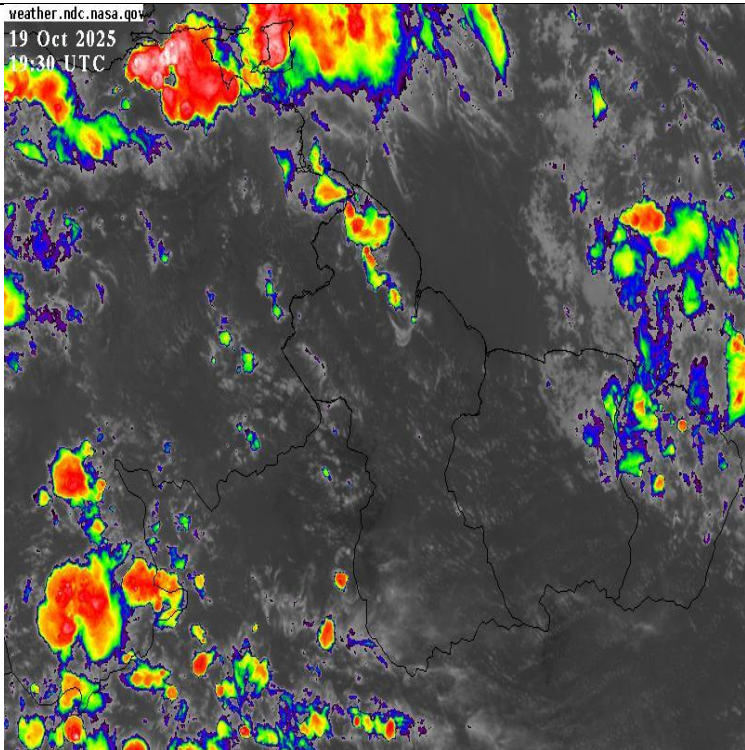
Synopsis: Passage of a tropical wave north of Guyana, generating mainly southeasterly flow. As the wave exits the region, weak amplitude low troughs are projected to produce some weak to moderate instabilities over the forecast area tonight into tomorrow.

Today’s weather review: Regions 1 and 2 observed partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers and thundershowers. All remaining regions observed mostly sunny skies with a few showers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, October 20 to 29, 2025, is 3.3 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate easterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 13 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday and Wednesday: Mostly cloudy skies with frequent showers and scattered thundershowers are likely across Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 15 mm and 40 mm within 24 hours.

Thursday through Saturday: Regions 7, 8, and 10 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated showers and thundershowers in the afternoon. All other regions mainly fair and sunny skies are likely to prevail. **Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 10 mm over inland regions; elsewhere, no significant rainfall is expected within 24 hours.**
