Weather Brief for Sunday, 26 October 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 26 October 2025 were available for most of the stations. **Matthews Ridges in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 29.2 mm.**

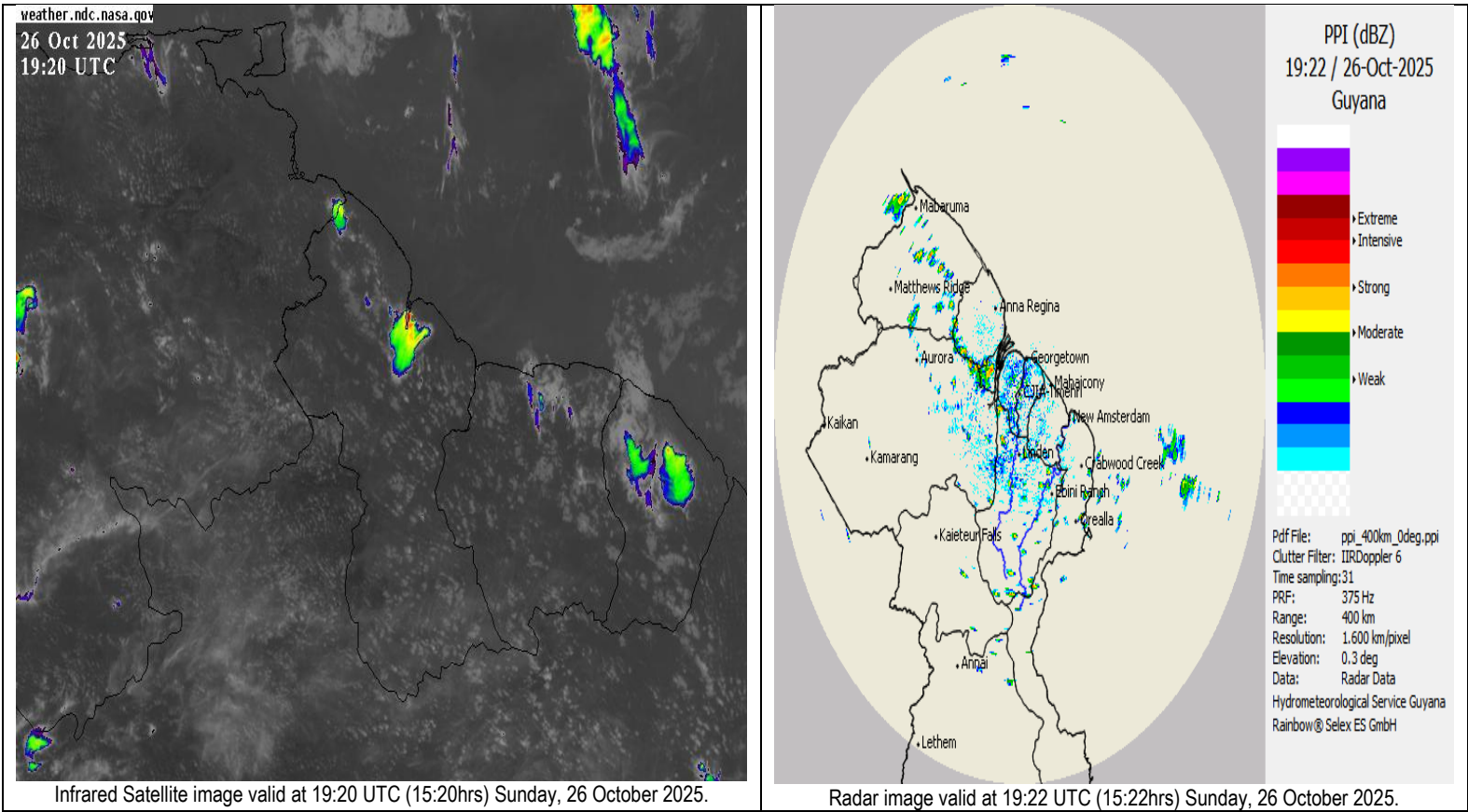
Synopsis: Continued dry air intrusion and ridging throughout most levels of the atmosphere, leading to mainly subsidence and stable conditions across the forecast area. However, trade wind moisture plumes and localized conditions produced some short-lived isolated instabilities. Similar atmospheric conditions are likely for the next 3 to 4 days.

Today’s weather review: Except for isolated weak to moderate showers and thundershowers over inland parts of regions 1 to 3, and 6 to 8 and 10, in the afternoon, partly cloudy and sunny skies dominated across these regions. All remaining regions observed mainly fair and sunny skies.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, October 27 to November 05, 2025, is 4.1 mm per day.

Spring Tide Advisory: The spring tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate easterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 6 and 11 seconds.
- Light to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Thursday: Southern and coastal regions can expect mainly fair and sunny skies with a few possible showers. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated afternoon showers and thundershowers. Rainfall is expected not to be significant over southern and coastal regions, and in other regions between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.

Friday and Saturday: Regions 1 to 3 and 7 can expect mostly cloudy skies with frequent showers and scattered thundershowers. All other regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected between 10 mm and 30 mm over regions 1 to 3 and 7, and in other regions between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.
