Weather Brief for Friday, 05 April 2024 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Friday, 05 April 2024 were available for most of the stations  
**Surama in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 38.7 mm**

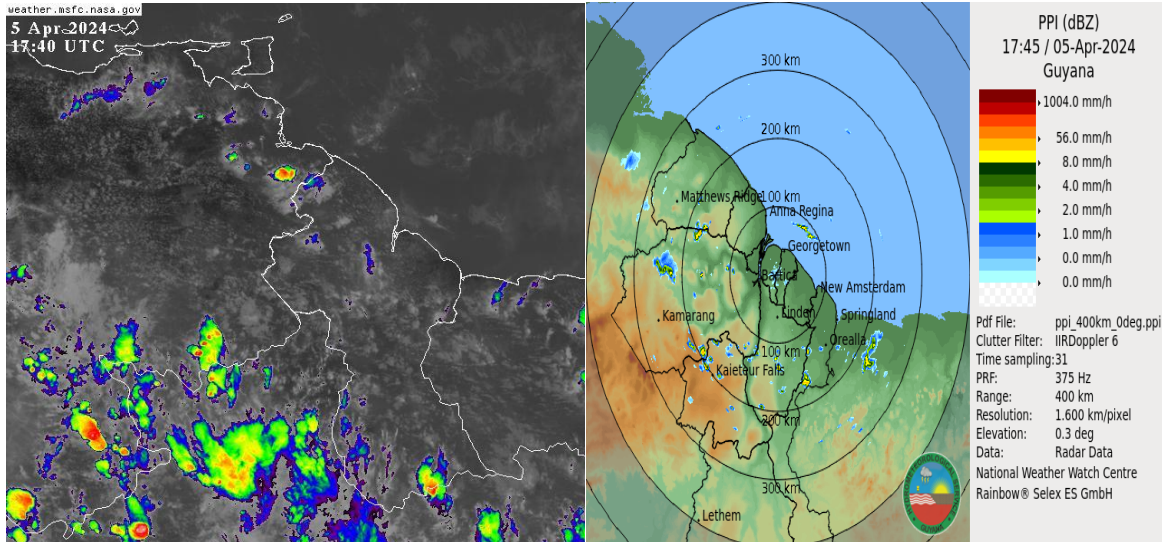
Synopsis: The ridge of high pressure has become the controlling feature over Guyana. Shallow moisture plumes within the Tradewinds produced isolated areas of weak instabilities.

Today's weather review: A mix of sunshine and clouds with a few brief showers were observed across Guyana.

**SPRING TIDE ADVISORY:** Persons are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect and will continue until Saturday, April 13, 2024. Spring tides coupled with high waves may lead to overtopping of the river and sea defense vulnerable areas. All necessary precautions should be taken.

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Sea conditions:

Moderate to rough in open water with northeast to easterly swells ranging from 2.0 to 2.5 meters (7 to 8 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 14 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh northeast to easterly winds.

Extended Forecast

Sunday to Thursday: Mostly fair and sunny skies with a mix of clouds and a few isolated to scattered light showers. **No significant rainfall is anticipated within 24 hours of accumulations.**
