Saturday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with frequent showers and thundershowers, over South region 9. In the other areas, occasional showers. Rainfall, between 20.0 mm and 30.0 mm over South region 9 . Elsewhere, between 5.0 and 15.0 mm .
