Weather Brief for Wednesday, 01 May 2024 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Wednesday, 01 May 2024 were available for most of the stations.

De Kinderen Front in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 70.3 mm.

Synopsis: The ridge of high pressure is the dominant feature affecting Guyana.


Today's weather review: Occasional cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers were observed throughout Guyana.

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Sea conditions:

Moderate in open water with northerly swells ranging from 1.5 to 2.0 meters (5 to 7 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 10 and 11 seconds.
- Moderate easterly winds.

Extended Forecast

<u>Friday and Saturday</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional light to moderate showers. Rainfall is expected between 10 to 20 mm within 24 hours.

<u>Sunday and Monday</u>, cloudy to overcast skies with frequent showers and rain. Thundershowers are likely over coastal areas during the morning hours. Rainfall is anticipated between 20 to 60 mm within 24 hours of accumulations. The highest values are likely on Sunday.

Tuesday, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers. Rainfall between 0 to 15 mm.
