Weather Brief for Wednesday, 24 July 2024 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, 24 July 2024 were available for most of the stations.

Hogg Island in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 39.0 mm

Synopsis: The weak to moderate instabilities of the ITCZ are affecting Guyana.


<u>Today's weather review</u>: Mostly cloudy skies with scattered to frequent showers and isolated thundershowers were observed over northern Guyana. Brief to scattered showers were observed elsewhere.

<u>SPRING TIDE ADVISORY:</u> Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Spring tides coupled with high waves may lead to overtopping of the river and sea defense vulnerable areas. All necessary precautions should be taken.

Sea conditions:

Smooth to moderate in open water with waves ranging from 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 9 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly winds.

Extended Forecast

<u>Friday:</u> Mostly cloudy skies with thundershowers and rain during the morning period. Rainfall is expected between 20 to 50 mm

<u>Saturday to Tuesday:</u> a mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered showers and possible isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is anticipated between 5 to 15 mm within 24 hours of accumulations.
